Hugo is a grandson of Rubeigh James Minney. Rubeigh's father was Joseph Rubyn born in Hong Kong in 1870. He married Esthere Mayohas whose family where Sephardic Jews from Spain. Joseph was born a cripple and did not walk until 19 years old. Joseph was the youngest of three. All the parent's money was left to Joseph which caused a family rift (money subsequently lost). His brother changed his name to Minny and had at least one son called Cyril¹. They emigrated to Australia after the war.

Joseph's father may have been Robert, born in Bedfordshire around 1820 (no trace in the index).

Bridgette Robinson of 1 Webstray Close, Walney Island, Barrow in Furness, Cumbria LA14 3YN.

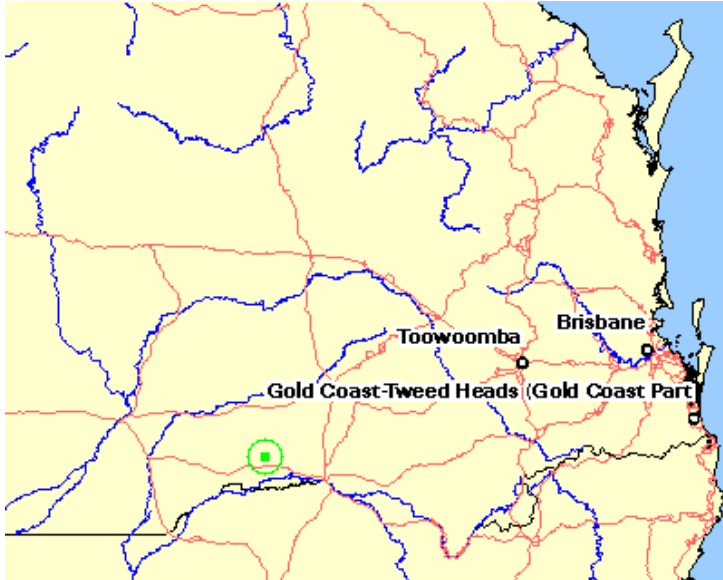
Bridgette is the daughter of James and Mary Minney. James was born in Glasgow the only son of John Minney. email; bridgette.robinson@virgin.net

Extracted from the Australian Geographic Place Names (Gazetter)

Minnel Creek



This is a stream in Queensland. The map reference is 28 21'00"S 149 48'00"E. On 1:100,000 Map Sheet 8841 Bungunya and 1:250,000 Map Sheet SH55-04 St George.

The small (faint) circle with the square inside denotes the exact location.

Minneys Creek



This is another stream, this time in New South Wales. The map reference is 28 58'00"S 152 35'00"E. On 1:100,000 Map Sheet 9440 Bonalbo and on 1:250,000 Map Sheet SH56-02 Warwick.

The next question is - how did they get their names? Over to our colleagues in Australia.

In the Gazetteer there are also 30 place names called Minnie; (bore, creek, gully, hill, lagoon, point, range (mountains), river, rock, springs, water, and grotto).

The Origin of Minney Creek

Lane County, Oregon

The above location was mentioned in the last newsletter. On an impulse I emailed the Public Information Officer at Lane County, he passed my message on and eventually it reached a Thomas Lanfear.

He emailed back, "Oregon Geographic Names, Sixth Edition, by Lewis L McArthur contains the following entry: "Minney Creek, LANE. Minney Creek flows into Gate Creek northeast of Vida. It is named for Benjamin F Minney who homesteaded along it in the 1890s."

I then contacted Thomas Lanfear and asked him if there were any Minneys still in the area (the wonders of email and all for a few pence!).

He replied with the three names, Harold F Minney, Steven M Minney and Mary Lynn Minney, all of Eugene.

I wrote to all three. Harold sent this reply:

"It was my grandfather, Ben Minney for whom Minney Creek was named. My grandparents were originally from Ohio. My father, John Frank was born in Uhrichville, Ohio in 1881. I believe my grandfather was also born there in 1861.

From Ohio they moved to Nebraska, probably near Lincoln. They were there for about three years. They were doing well there but my grandmother was frightened of the tornadoes so when father was ten they moved first to Portland then to a place near Independence.

In the spring of 1896 they moved to the McKenzie river area where they took up a homestead where the creek ran through. In 1898 they bought a small hotel and livery stable for people travelling up the McKenzie valley.

Grandfather and grandmother only had one child (my father). My parents had five children; Art born in 1911 and died in 1986, Gladys born in 1915 and died in 1988, Thelma born 1917 (still living), myself born in 1918 (still here), Shirley born in 1930.

I have never seen Minney Creek. Tried to find it when I was a teenager with two friends but we got lost! We followed another stream until we knew where we were and never tried again.

I was in the military for 24 years and I just never went back looking for it."

Harold sent a family group record sheet. This showed that his great grandfather was Thomas Minney born circa 1815 in Philadelphia. He was married twice, to Cynthia Rinard in 1838, Ohio and Mary J Thompson, date unknown, but after 1850. He is believed to have had fathered between 19 and 21 children. He died on 8th March 1890 at Chempworth, Tuscarawas County, Ohio.

Unfortunately, I cannot find Thomas in the Minney index.

The Inhabitants of Cardington 1782

This list is a very early and rare population census carried out during the year of 1782 and applied only to the village of Cardington, Beds and the surrounding hamlets.

It is not known why the list was made or by who. Although the census is dated 1st January 1782 work was carried out in the field for some months after.

The census has been published in book form with extra notes added by the Beds Historical Society² (volume 52). These extra notes include computer ages and later events taken from the parish registers. These extra notes can make the entries confusing to follow.

The following abbreviations have been used; F = Fenlake hamlet, H = Harrowden hamlet, C = Cotton End hamlet, P = Pastors hamlet, NBR = No baptism reference, NLR = No Listing Reference.

Cottage No 7

F7.2 Wife Elizabeth King, maiden name Minney. Born at Cardington. Baptised 25th Oct 1747. Age 33 (computer age 34).

Cottage No 25

H25.1 Occupier John Minney, labourer, born at Cardington. Baptised 5th Dec 1742. Married 17th Jan 1771. Both residents of Cardington. Buried 8th Jan 1819, aged 77. Fenlake OA relief. Age 29 (computer age 39)

H25.2 Wife Lucy Minney, maiden name Beard, born at Cardington SL (?) NBR Cardington. Age 28. Buried 7th Mar 1827, aged 75.

- H25.3 1st Child Elizabeth³ at School by Mr Whitbread. Age 10 years. Baptised 8th Dec 1771, married 12th October 1793 to William Thomas. Age 10.6 (computer age 10).
- H25.4 2nd Child Samuel - twain (twin) of William baptised 20th Jan 1773. Married 5th Sep 1803. Age 8.9 (computer age 8).
- H25.5 3rd Child William - twain (twin) of Samuel.
- H25.6 4th Child Lucy, baptised 3rd Dec 1775. Married 11th Oct 1799 to John Barker (from Hadly, Middx). Age 5.3 (computer age 6).
- H25.7 5th Child Hannah-Meriah, baptised 15th Feb 1778 (as Anna Maria), married 22nd Dec 1807 to John Joice. Age 4 (computer age 3).

In the parish register there is a baptism of John son of John and Lucy Minney on 12th Aug 1781. He was buried on 25th Nov 1781.

The Winged Colt of Casa Mia⁶

This Minney reference turned up in a reading book list for school children based in the USA. It referred to a fictional character called Mrs Minney in the above titled book. The book was written by Betsey Byars, a well known children's author.

I have reprinted here the introduction from the book cover.

"When Mrs Minney announced that Uncle Coot's mare had given birth to a winged colt in her barn, Uncle Coot was sure of only one thing. She had made a mistake. 'Mrs Minney, whatever those things turn out to be they won't be wings.'

"Uncle Coot was a retired film stunt man, embittered by life's troubles and disappointments. His most recent trouble was the unexpected arrival at his ranch of his nephew, Charles, a serious town boy whose knowledge of life came almost entirely from books and films and who could not see Uncle Coot as anything but a hero of the screen. Uncle Coot had no illusions at all, and when he finally inspected the colt in Mrs Minney's barn and saw the very

obvious pair of wings on the sides of the little animal, it was perhaps the worst shock of his whole dangerous career. Yet, all he could do was to accept the situation and return to his ranch with a delighted Charles and the strange colt."

"The story of how this unlikely trio settle down together makes a funny and unusual book. For, in trying to solve the problems of owning a horse who can fly while they are merely humans who can walk, Charles and Uncle Coot find common ground and come to understand each other at last."

I enjoyed reading the book, the characters were well drawn, and the scenery atmospheric - clearly, not just a children's book.

I managed to find Betsy Byars address in `South Carolina (her web site is www.BetsyByars.com, no email though). Here is her reply to the question 'Why Mrs Minney?'

"It was nice to hear from a Minney! Miss Minney was my daughter's second grade teacher. We were living in Morgantown, West Virginia at the time, and the school was Suncrest Elementary. This was in the early sixties so I don't imagine she's still there. I'd heard the name from my daughter a lot that year, and since the character in the book was about the same age, I used it."

"Thanks for your kind words about 'The Winged Colt of Casa Mia'. Actually it was on TV in the US - part of a series called Saturday Morning Specials. It was shown in three half-hour segments. Mrs Minney was played effectively by Jane Withers (a former child star who was the antidote to Shirley Temple's sweetness in a couple of movies). Uncle Coot was played less effectively by Slim Pickins."

I wonder who the teacher Miss Minney was, and did she know she was one of the central characters in a novel?

The Scotland Connection

Some recent unconnected events have led me to believe that it may be worth investigating links with Scotland.

When I first started looking into the history of the Minney name I recall one relative claiming that back in the 1950s she had had a researcher tell her that the name was of Scottish origin. I assumed that the researcher had deduced that Minney was a variant spelling of Menzies (pronounced Mingies) or Mennie without doing too much delving. I certainly did not look any further because there was no single clue to point in that direction.

However, this may change. In the last newsletter I included references from the 1871 Ontario Census Heads of Household Index. There was a James Minnie of Scottish ethnic origin amongst the four entries (Minne, Minney, Minnie and Minny). At the time I believed I had downloaded all the Minney like references because I assumed the file was in alpha order. Not so. I rechecked and found the following;

Anne Minne

age 19, born Ontario, Free Presbyterian, Irish ethnic origin, no occupation given, District of Peterborough W.

Robert Minnie

age 48, born Scotland, Irish Presbyterian, Scottish ethnic origin, occupation of Minister, District Lindsay Town

George Minnie

age 34, born Scotland, Canada Presbyterian, Scottish ethnic origin, occupation Farmer, District of Mount Forest

Sidney Minnie

age 37, born Ontario, Episcopal Methodist, Scottish ethnic origin, occupation Farmer, District of Elzevir

James Minnie

age 66, born Scotland, Church of Scotland, Scottish ethnic origin, occupation Farmer, District of Garafraxa West

Elizabeth Minnie

age 16, born Ontario, Church of England, English ethnic origin, occupation Domestic Servant, District of St Marys Ward

There are a number of Minnie entries in current telephone directories in Canada and I had assumed they were of French origin.

I also received an email earlier this year from Chris Minney of San Juan Island, Washington. (visit his website on www.rockisland.com)

"We came from Scotland about five or six generations ago. The Minneys stayed back East for a few years, then headed out West in covered wagons. They roughed it in sod houses in Nebraska and Colorado, then the remainder moved to the West coast.

I don't have anything going back past Glasgow (I think Charles Minney was the first man over here)."

And a few weeks later I received this from the FONS database, another Scottish entry;

The Edinburgh Gazette

11th December 1846

WAR OFFICE, December 8th, 1846

"Non-commissioned Officers and Private Soldiers of 50th Regiment supposed to be dead, they have been missing since the recent Battles on the Sutlej.....William Minney (amongst 14 others)."

Enquiries show that the 50th Regiment became the 1st Bn. Queens Own (Royal West Kent Regiment) in 1881. No obvious Scottish connection here.

The Sutlej River was part of the Punjab, India. There were two wars in the area, 1846 and 1848, the Sikhs finally surrendering to the British Army in March 1849.

These references become even more interesting when Bridgette Robinson contacted me regarding her ancestry in Scotland (see New Members). I am hoping to obtain more family details from her and hopefully link up some of these Minnie/Minney entries.

I would appreciate it if anyone who has access to the 1881 census index for Scotland could look up Minnie and Minney for me.

UK INFO

A recent innovation in the UK has been the publishing of a directory purporting to show over 40 million names and address in the UK (with telephone numbers). I have extracted here the surnames of Minay, Miney, Minell, Minnell, Minney and Minnie. Due to space I have only included the post town. If you want additional details then contact me. The directory is not perfect, for instance I am not in it! Note the Minnie entries for Scotland.

7th Sept 1850 - Elizabeth Minney, committed for trial

28th Dec 1906 - George Minney, found drowned

Elizabeth Minney - Robbery By A Servant

Beds Times 7th Sept 1850

On Saturday Elizabeth Minney underwent an examination before C F Palgrave Esq. Mayor, on a charge of robbing her master, Mr Ballard, draper, of the High Street. The prosecutor had for a long time past entertained suspicions that some mysterious person was frequently making free with his cash, but could form no idea of the guilty party. At last, however, he adopted means to find out the thief. He marked a number of shillings which he left in his bureau and on going to it afterwards he found 3s. had been stolen. He accused the servants of the theft and demanded his money, when the prisoner produced her purse containing 3 marked coins which Mr Ballard identified as his property. It appears that Elizabeth is a person of some taste; china and chimney ornaments were found in her sleeping room; also a mahogany chest of drawers, and other useful household appendages. Her wardrobe is likewise rather extensive, twenty-six pairs of stockings, dresses, shawls, handkerchiefs, a watch, smelling-bottle, silver mounted brooches, bracelets, gold and other rings in variety. Most of her linen too, is of very fine fabric, and made in first-rate style. She endeavoured to account for the possession of these things by saying they were given to her by different relations. Committed for trial but allowed bail.

The result of her trial is not known, but Elaine found Elizabeth in the 1851 census list of prisoners at Bedford gaol. She is stated to be from Little Staughton, Beds and born in 1829.

I only have two Elizabeths in the index who might fit the bill; Elizabeth Ann daughter of William and Mary Minney baptised 1st June 1828 at Kempston All Saints, Bedford or, more likely Elizabeth daughter of Henry and Elizabeth Minney baptised 8th May 1835 at Little Staughton.

Found Drowned¹⁰

Beds Times 28th Dec 1906

An inquest was held at The Swan Inn, Goldington, on Wednesday morning by the Deputy Coroner (Mr G J Morrah Whyley) touching the death of George Minney, of 10 Sandhurst Place, South End, Bedford.

¹⁰ The number of Minneys that have drowned seems to me to be rather high. There have been four (including this one) reported in this newsletter so far; Charlotte Minney at Horton, Northants 1855 (Summer 96), William Herbert Minney at Cople, Beds 1900 (Jan 90) and Lois Minney at Northampton 1944 (Winter 96/7).

Mr Arthur Ballinghall was chosen foreman of the jury.

James Fensome spoke to seeing the body in the river a few yards beyond the rollers towards Newnham Bridge at 7.45 on Christmas Day. The crown of his head was out of the water and the tail of his coat was floating on the surface. Arthur Minney identified the deceased as that of his brother, who was a soldier. He had been in the South African war and had seen foreign service in India. He was 28 years of age. Sidney Bowes of the Rink Tavern, Duck Mill Lane said deceased came to his house at 9 and left at 9.30pm on Monday night. P.c. Pedley spoke of removing the body from the embankment to the public house at Goldington. The Jury verdict was "Found Drowned".

Elaine says that her grandfather, George Patrick Minney told about his Uncle drowning near the suspension bridge in Bedford. George Frederick Minney was the son of Spencer and Jane Minney. He was born in Colmworth in 1877.

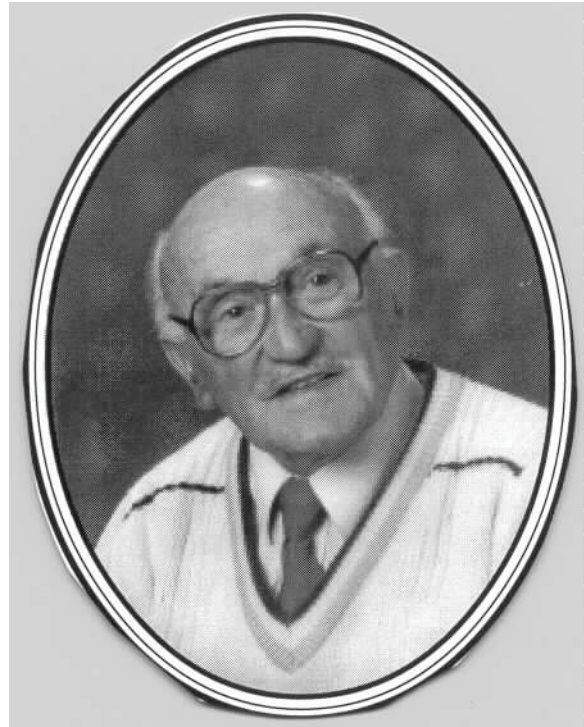
